

Germantown's big first inning throttles Pirates

The hot bats of a first-place foe were too much for the Port Washington baseball team in a North Shore Conference game Monday.

Host Germantown scored seven runs in the first inning and rolled to a 12-4 win over the Pirates.

Port held a brief 2-0 lead before the Warhawks batted.

Germantown, which improved to 7-2 in NSC play, outhit Port, 11-8. Jordan Kuczynski led the Warhawks with a 3-for-4 effort and three RBI.

Sam Lepak was 2-for-3 with a double for the Pirates (0-12).

In another NSC game Monday, Grafton was blanked by Slinger, 4-0.

John Sprayberry limited the host Black Hawks to four hits, striking out six and walking four.

Slinger (7-6) scored two runs in the first inning and two runs in the fifth. Jake Bjorklund had a triple and two RBI for the Owls.

Brad Parsons was 2-for-3 for Grafton (4-8).

In a Central Lakeshore Conference game Monday, Ozaukee edged Elkhart Lake-Glenbeulah, 2-1.

The game was scoreless through four innings. After host Ozaukee took a 1-0 lead in the fifth, both teams scored once in the sixth.

Lee Wysocki pitched the final two innings in relief for the win.

Jeremy Wichmann was 2-for-3 to lead Ozaukee, which improved its league mark to 7-3.
