

Ozaukee girls shoot blanks against Brillion

It had been a long time since anyone held the Ozaukee girls' basketball scoreless in a quarter.

It had been even longer since anyone held them to single digits for every period.

And few people can remember the last time the Warriors scored only 25 points in a game.

All of that happened Monday night when the Brillion Lions overwhelmed the host Warriors, 60-25, in a nonconference contest.

"Brillion did a good job of executing their offense and getting a lot of inside shots," said Ozaukee coach Lee LeMahieu, whose team fell to 9-4 overall.

"Their defense was very effective and never let us get anything going offensively."

The Lions (12-1) used their quickness to push the ball up court. All but seven of their 27 field goals came on layups.

Ozaukee stayed within 26-17 at halftime, but a 19-8 run by Brillion in the third quarter turned the game into a rout.

The Warriors failed to score in the fourth period.

Brillion's Shawna Levash led all scorers with 20 points, and teammate Kylie Moxie had 14.

Guard Kaitlyn Thill had 19 points but was the only Ozaukee player with more than two. Thill's total included a pair of three-point baskets.

Brillion outrebounded the Warriors, 37-19.
